### Reduced price tickets are available to the following upon presentation of relevant documentation:

- 1) pupils attending state schools, students of colleges of social service employees, students in higher education, PhD students;
- 2) pupils, students and PhD students who are citizens of EU member states, the Swiss Confederation and European Free Trade Association (EFTA) member states - parties to the European Economic Area agreement;
- 3) pupils of schools run by social organisations abroad, registered with a database conducted by a certified unit under the Education Ministry, who are studying Polish language, history, geography, Polish culture or other subjects taught in Polish, and who are under 18 years of age;

- 4) pupils of state schools of other countries studying Polish language, history, geography, Polish culture or other subjects taught in Polish, who are under 18 years of age;
- 5) pupils of Polish sections functioning within state schools of other countries, who are under 18 years of age;
- 6) pupils of European schools operating under the Convention defining the Statute of the European schools concluded in Luxembourg on 21 June 1994 (Journal of Laws of 2005, item 10) who are studying Polish language, history, geography, Polish culture or other subjects taught in Polish, and who are under 18 years of age;
- 7) persons over 65 years of age, pensioners and disability benefit recipients as well as disabled people with their carers, who are citizens of EU member states, the Swiss Confederation and European Free Trade Association (EFTA) member states that are parties to the European Economic Area agreement;
- 8) teachers
  - a) of state schools, and units of state education, borstals and shelters for minors,
  - b) of schools operating in EU member states, the Swiss Confederation and European Free Trade Association (EFTA) member states - parties to the European Economic Area agreement,
  - c) of schools run by social organisations abroad, registered in a database conducted by a certified unit under the Education Ministry,
  - d) teaching Polish language, history, geography, Polish culture or other subjects taught in Polish in:
    - schools functioning within the state education of other countries
    - Polish sections functioning within state schools of other countries
    - European schools operating under the Convention defining the Statute of the European schools concluded in Luxembourg on 21 June 1994;
- 9) recipients of badge 'For care of monuments', recipients of 'Distinguished Cultural Service' honorary badge, recipients of the Honorary Badge for Polish Culture or those distinguished with an honorary title 'Meritorious National Cultural Contributor,'
- 10) veterans.

Free admission is available to the following upon presentation of relevant documentation:

- 1) recipients of the Order of the White Eagle, the War Order of Virtuti Militari, the Order of Merit of the Republic of Poland, the Gloria Artis Medal for Merit to Culture;
- 2) employees of museums on the State Museum Register;
- 3) members of the International Council of Museums (ICOM) or the International Council on Monuments and Sites (ICOMOS);
- 4) Polish Charter holders;
- 5) children under 7 years of age;
- 6) veterans and injured veterans
- 7) holders of the Mazovian Card for Families with Children with Disabilities (free admission for the child and carer).

Admission to museum exhibitions is free of charge on Thursdays.

Visitors attending museum lessons, workshops and family workshops are entitled to also visit the exhibitions.
